



Children with SEND might lose their right to important help at school called an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP).



The government might stop giving EHCPs to children in normal schools. Local councils find EHCPs too costly and want fewer of them.



Most children with SEND go to normal schools. Many of them have EHCPs. These plans help them learn and grow by giving them the support they need.



Without EHCPs, children with SEND may struggle in normal schools and might need to go to special schools that are full, or leave school.



Many want to keep EHCPs. A group called SOCR is fighting for them. Their petition has over 108,000 signatures.



For over 40 years, children with SEND have had the right to get the help they need at school. Cutting these rights would be bad for families.



Rights
